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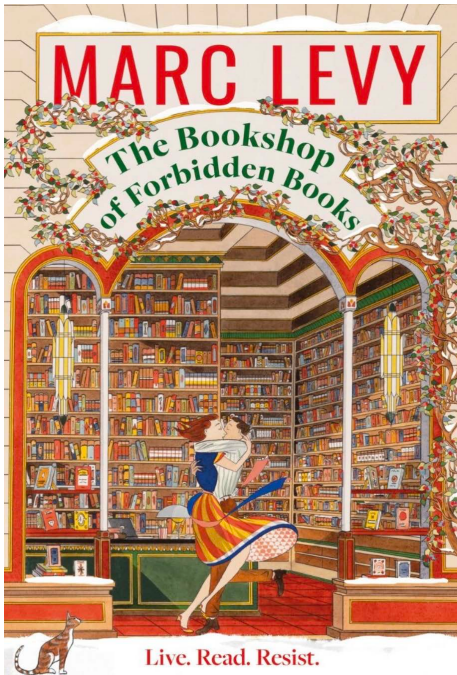

From that moment on, Mitch finds himself caught between a burning desire for revenge and an irresistible desire for love...

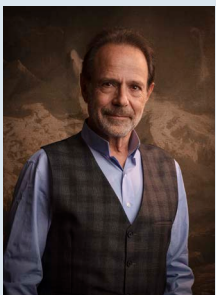

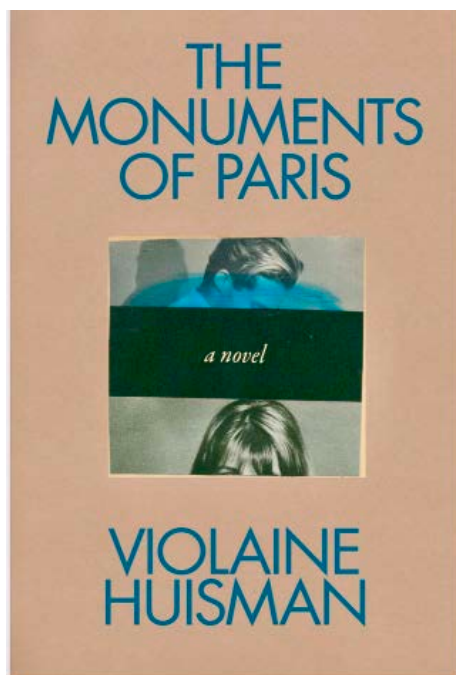
The thing is Rila's students all recognise her—they just can't figure out from where.

In this heartwarming collection of his most memorable cases, we meet Hiroshi, learn about his calling as a pet detective, and meet the feline friends he's helped along the way.

There's Tai-chan, the 21-year-old cat who goes missing during a house burglary, and Sora, the Russian Blue who likes to sneak out, going as far as three kilometers in one night. A widow is left at a loss after her cat disappears, seemingly in search of her husband who died just a week before. And Hiroshi searches for seven months for a brother and sister who end up surviving on their own in the woods. The collection also features one dog, terrier Toto, who is kidnapped by an unassuming neighbor.

Japan is no stranger to natural disasters, and in one chapter Hiroshi reflects on the 2011 Tōhoku Earthquake, in which huge numbers of people were forced to evacuate their homes, taking nothing—not even their pets—with them. In *The Cat Detective Case Files*, Hiroshi teaches us that no pet is the same. While he has a methodical, Sherlock Holmes-like approach to solving each case, there are a million different reasons for pets to disappear. These cases are at once heartbreaking and uplifting, and showcase the love between humans and their pets in its truest form.



Hiroshi Fujiwara was born in Hyogo Prefecture in 1969. He is an animal detective specialising in lost pets. He founded Pet Rescue in 1997 and has handled over 3,000 cases. 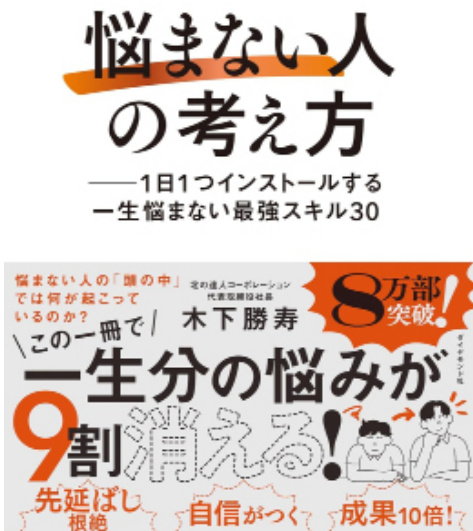
Have you ever looked back on something and thought, "Why did I worry about that?"

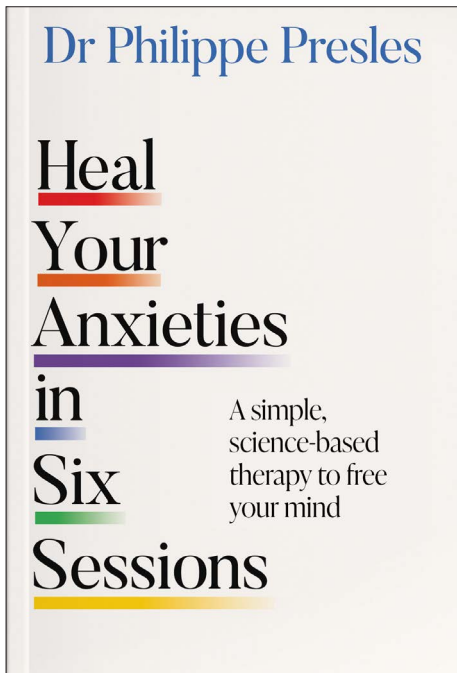

Explosive People is an investigative memoir by MacArthur scholar and critically acclaimed author of *Against the World* that explores rage through the murky and maligned diagnosis known as Intermittent Explosive Disorder, the most widespread mental illness you've never heard of.

Every outburst of rage—regardless of how misfired—harbours a history. Sometimes it is a lineage of personal wounds, feelings of being inadequate, unappreciated, unheard. But political and social forces, including gender, class, and racial inequality also inflict and infect the wounds we carry. “Intermittent Explosive Disorder” (IED) is the only condition in the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM) that centers on anger. Even by the most conservative estimate, IED afflicts more people than suffer from schizophrenia, autism spectrum disorder, and all forms of bipolar disorder combined. Classified as an “impulse-control” disorder, IED goes largely undiagnosed, but it is recognizable, especially among those who live closest to it.

Tara Zahra does. So does her father, and his mother, and generations of their family going back years. When Tara decides to start her own family, she wonders: What will this intergenerational history of rage mean for her own child? How much of her anger is hereditary, environmental, cultural, or caused by something else?

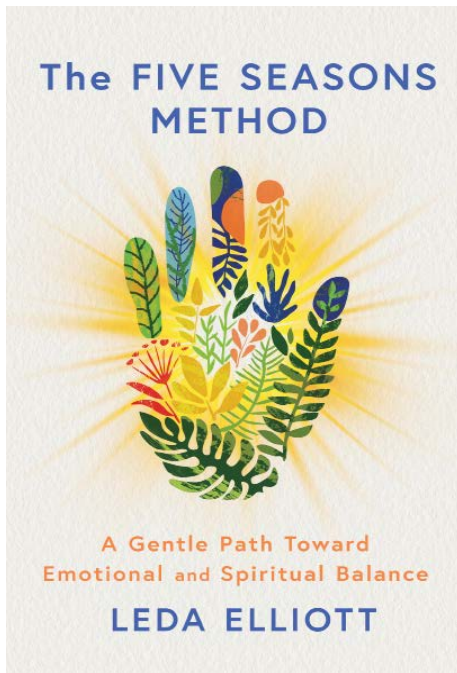
Explosive People explores the broader history of anger and treatment of IED. In it, Tara seeks out the brain scientists, psychiatrists, sociologists and criminologists who have researched anger and aggression, alongside the mental health professionals who treat it and others who suffer from it. She also confronts the controversy around the IED diagnosis itself and the stigmas associated with it. More than a simply ancestry project or a quest for self-improvement, *Explosive People* breaks open the silence and shame that surrounds IED and related disorders and forges a path toward a better understanding of anger and mental illness for all.

Tara Zahra is the Hanna Holborn Gray professor of History at the University of Chicago and the Roman Family Director of the Neubauer Collegium for Culture and Society. She is the author of five books, including *Against the World: Anti-Globalism and Mass Politics between the World Wars*. Zahra has been the recipient of a MacArthur Fellowship, a Guggenheim Fellowship, and is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. A lifelong amateur dancer, her current research focuses on the intersections of dance and history. She lives with her family in Chicago, reads Italian, German, French, Czech, and has lived for periods in Austria, Germany, France, the Czech Republic, and Italy.
